Instead of the conservative motto, "A fair day's wage for a fair day's work," we must inscribe on our banner the revolutionary watchwords, "Abolition of the wage system."








So What's Going On Now?



Contact me for more information. I'm sure you'll recognize me. (I'm the one who is always in the paper and gets credit for everything).



C E N T R A L I A

Sometimes the nicest seeming towns hide the worst conditions-futility, bigotry, and explosive violence. As battlefield stories of World War I horrified the country the I.W.W. was spreading the word that the poor were dying to protect profit, and that the bosses weren't worth dying for. Denouncing the war, calling for international working class sofidarity and organizing on the job had made the Wobs some powerful enemies. In November of 1919 the right wing campaign against the I.W.W. culminated in a trashed union hall, all known Wobs in jail and a lynching.

The violence in Centralia has it's roots in the upheaval of the preceding years. In 1917 the U.S. entered WWI. Production of planes required spruce wood, found primarily in Oregon and Washington. Working conditions were lousy, while big business destroyed the forests and reaped record profits. In these years workers more and more were organizing, and they were winning.

The jubilant gains made by working people did not go unnoticed by the men running the country. The American Legion was founded in 1919, by ex-servicemen pledging to "maintain law and order and foster 100% Americanism." The Legion and other fraternal organizations like the Elks were to play the role of armed vigilantes in Centralia and elsewhere. News of the Russian revolution spread as did the Seattle general strike. Meanwhile on the federal level General A. Mitchel Palmer received half a million dollars from congress to establish the General Intelligent Agency with J. Edgar Hoover (this was later to become the C.I.A.).

The U.S anti-radical and anti-union propaganda bore rotten fruit in the small towns with mob violence and oppression. Standing strong in the face of this Wobs fought back in self defense.

The events surrounding Armistice Day, 1919 have been hotly contested ever since. A parade of veterans and some union members were the center of gun shots that left a handful of servicemen and a Wob shot. All hell broke loose and one Wob, Wesley Everest, himself a veteran, retreated while brandishing a gun. For his crime of survival he was first jailed, drug out of jail, castrated and hung from a bridge on the Chehalis River. By the time things started to calm down all known (and suspected) Wobs were in jail along with their legal defense. Many of the Wobs were framed up on bogus charges and sent to prison. Wesley Everet's death was found by the law to be a suicide. The town was to slump into a silence that lasted almost until the modern era. In Centralia a beautiful mural now commemorates I.W.W. martyrs, and the direct action fights for both free speech and the eight hour work day, both important steps to improving conditions, at work and at home. The campaign of repression against the 1.W.W. was meant to silence us but we are still speaking out today.

A Brief Defining of Sexism Within Movements

SHITWORK:

In an organization, often times womyn get stuck doing all the work that has to be stone but no one wants to do. This includes mailing letters, folding pamphlets, making copies, making telephone calls and other clerical type work. Men are the ones seen in the media, facilitating meetings, making decisions and other more seen and exciting jobs. This in turn makes the womyn in the group invisible and unappreciated. I have seen womyn within the movement who do all the shit work, such as folding pamphlets, become a joke. Men learn to take advantage of the womyn doing the shit work rather than help.

RECOGNITION:

The fact that women tend to do a lot of the behind the scene work leads to women failing to receive deserved recognition. Often times when things are planned, the men in the group are thanked. I remember a situation in which a conference was planned and carried out by the hard work of two main people: a man and a women. The man was thanked continuously for his hard work while the women could only stand back and hear all the recognition go to him.

The majority of organizations are represented by men, and it is the men who are thought of as the leaders. For example, the Public Interest Environmental Law Conference at the University of Oregon has twice as many male speakers as womyn. Go to almost any conference and count the number of womyn speakers and the number of men. Almost always you will find that there is a disproportionate ratio of men. Men are seen writing the articles, writing the books, talking to cameras, talking to the radio, and making presentations. Womyn are perfectly capable of doing these things but are repressed from our society to do so. The work of womyn who do these things (write articles/books) is ignored or devalued. Author of Vegan: The New Ethics of Eating, Erik Marcus, discussed his experiences with womyn in the movement from his travels around the US. He said that 4/5 of the activists he meets within the movement are womyn. Yet, 4/5 of the authors seen within the movement are male. This observation clearly illustrates the need for womyn to receive recognition and encouragement to participate in all levels of activism.

One reason why this does not occur is because womyn's voices are often repressed or simply ignored. Often times, womyn will come up with an idea and not be recognized for it. Then a man will come up with the same exact idea, even at the same meeting, and it will be heard and considered. It is hard for womyn to speak up and have confidence within activism when their ideas and voices are ignored. Since females are taught to be quiet and submissive, while males from a young age are taught the opposite, the way we communicate must change. An extra effort must be made to hear all voices and respect all that is said by all individuals in a group.

REPRESENTATION:

When men take on the majority of the media spokesperson roles or become the "leader" for the group in other ways, womyn do not get represented in society. What does it say when men of groups are always the ones being heard on the radio or on television or quoted in papers. Where are all the womyn? Womyn voices have just as much power, and just as much truth as any man's. Womyn can engage the listeners just as well, if not better.

OBJECTIFICATION:

Womyn often times fall victim to men in the group who use the womyn's body to appeal others to the group. Womyn have been asked to dress certain ways to appeal to men. This is a complete degradation of the womyn as a person and falls to the societal ideals which portray a false sense of beauty. Womyn also must deal with sexual harassment by fellow activists and are looked upon as a body, rather than another activist with ideas and abilities to achieve liberation like everyone else. Many times womyn may also be thought of as "so and so's girlfriend" rather than by their own identity. This takes away their own contributions of ideas to the group and takes away a feeling of acceptance.

BACKLASH:

Although it would be nice to be able to simply say when you feel oppressed, this simply can not happen. Males confronted with the idea that they are sexist will not only deny it, but backlash against those trying to speak up. Often womyn hear things like "this isn't about recognition" or "you're being too sensitive". These reactions show many men's inability to accept responsibility of how their actions effect womyn.

SOLUTIONS:

Womyn need to support one another on this issue. This may mean having womyn sessions to talk about the issue, or help when another womyn is confronting this problem. If enough womyn work together to create change, maybe then people will start to listen. Womyn need to accept their anger about the issue, let themselves have their feelings and fight against what is going on. People creating an oppressive environment must be confronted in a fashion where they can not just deny or brush things off. This is why womyn's support of one another is so crucial.

Men also have a crucial role. When a womyn confronts a man about being sexist, they must listen, no matter how they feel. Men who see when sexism takes place must speak up. They are the ones that other males will listen to. Men need to be aware of what is sexist and help create an environment where everyone feels comfortable speaking up. Many womyn feel it is a male's duty to solve the problem since they will be listened to more and that it shouldn't be womyn's responsibility to stop sexism since it is men who perpetrate it.

It is also crucial for men to truly listen when womyn name sexist behavior. Men cannot detect and name sexism equally to womyn. Men need to understand that they were raised in a culture that socializes them to be sexist and not even realize it. They simply cannot know as much about sexism as womyn because they have never experienced it personally. This is why it is crucial that when womyn name sexist behavior, men need to listen and not defend their actions. Just as if a person of color tells a caucasian person they did something racist, they need to listen up because they can never know what it is like to experience racism. Womyn's voices simply must be heard over men's when it comes to issues of sexism.

Hopefully with males speaking up for womyn and creating this equal environment, womyn supporting one another, and males LISTENING to womyn when confronted, sexism within the movement can eventually be squashed.
